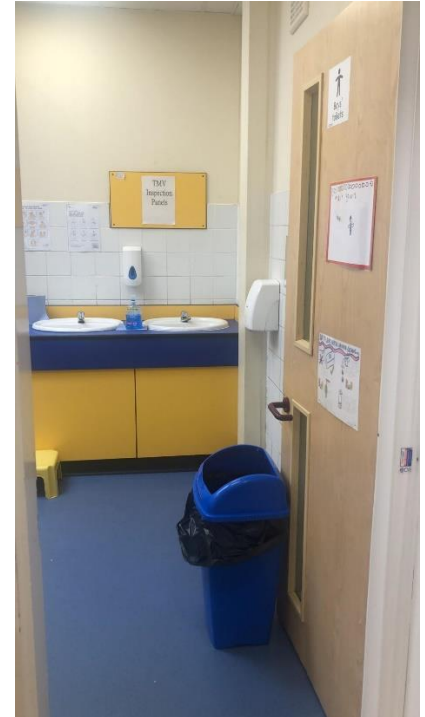
This is the

What will be expected of me in Year 4?

- I will stay in my seat at my table when I am working

- I will get homework in a folder on a Friday. Homework needs to be returned by Wednesday the next week. I will put completed homework in a tray at the front of the classroom and I will tick my name off so the teachers know I have done it
- I will put all letters in my reading folder and make sure that my parents get these letters or return them to school. (The teachers will not look in my reading folder for things)
- I will always try my best
- I will always speak to a grown up if something is bothering me
- I will always ask if I want to leave the room i.e. to go to the toilet
- At hometime I will stay in my seat until my name is called and then I will go outside and straight to my grown up
