What will be expected of me in Reception?

- I will bring a drinks bottle every day
- I will bring my PE kit. It can stay on my peg unless I am using it, or my grown up wants me to take it home to wash (PE kits are always sent home every half term)
- I will bring my reading folder into school every day
- We don't bring in toys or things from home, unless it has been arranged first (show and tell)
- I will follow the BEE rules (Be safe, Be kind, Be respectful, Be proud)
- I will always try my best
- I will always speak to a grown up if something is bothering me
- At hometime, I will stay where I am until my name is called and then I will go outside and straight to my grown up

What does a typical day in Reception look like?

8.50 am	Ten Minute Task
9.10 am	Phonics groups
9.30 am	Carpet whole class time
9:45am	Focus learning/independent learning
10.35 am	Snack time/story - Wash hands
10.50 am	Focus learning/independent learning
11:30 am	Carpet time
11:45 am	Wash hands - Dinner
1.00 pm	Maths groups
1.30 pm	Readers/focus groups/independent learning
2.30 pm	Tidy up time
2.45 pm	Story time / singing time / Show and Tell
3.15 pm	Home time

- *Some days will be slightly different as we have Whole School assemblies on Monday and Friday and a Key Stage Assembly on Wednesday (We do not go into these at first)*
