Curriculum Matters

One of our themes this half term is <u>Science based</u> - 'Can you feel the force?'

- The force of gravity acting between Earth and falling objects
- The effects of air resistance, water resistance and friction
- How mechanisms affect forces

Wherever possible, children will learn from direct experience and complete hands-on investigations.

Our other theme is the <u>History based</u> 'How crime and punishment has changed over time'

- Changes over time relating to crime and punishment
- Comparing different time frames using research and different sources

English

This half term, we shall be studying

- Narrative poetry based on 'The Highwayman'.
- Recount linked to 'The Highwayman'- using features of the text type and a highwayman biography.

Sentence level work will include the development of a range of more complex sentence types that help to make children's writing more interesting for the reader. Word level work will include further developing advanced punctuation marks, including commas, brackets, colons and in-speech punctuation, figurative language and the different uses of the apostrophe.

Home target: To use a wider range of sentence types independently, following on from work in class (applying Spag skills)




We shall be concentrating on the following topics this half term:

- Summarising addition, subtraction, multiplication and division using reasoning and problem solving questions
- Fractions (addition and subtraction of fractions, equivalence, converting improper fractions to mixed-numbers and multiplication of fractions)
- Decimals
- Percentages

Home target: To ensure that knowledge of multiplication tables up to 12 \times 12 (including division facts) is secure.
