<p>March</p> <p style="font-size: 2em;">↓</p> <p>July</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) Physical work packs with instructions were provided for all pupils with a wide range of curriculum tasks. These packs were also uploaded to the school website for parents who preferred to download. 2) KS1 and KS2 teachers communicated with parents via email – checking in on wellbeing and supporting parents and pupils with any queries around the work set. Teachers were also able to provide targeted feedback when parents emailed work through. 3) EYFS teachers communicated through Seesaw App (already set up) – giving detailed daily instructions for tasks and providing feedback and support to parents. 4) Zoom calls were introduced for KS2 pupils/parents to provide wellbeing support and social interaction.
<p>September</p> <p style="font-size: 2em;">↓</p> <p>ongoing</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 5) KS2 teachers set up to use Microsoft Teams with specific training on the following functions: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Setting assignments (which we are using to set normal school homework to enable staff, parents and pupils to familiarise themselves with the software prior to possibly needing to use it in a lockdown/year group isolation) - Recording and uploading teaching videos to support pupil understanding (should a lockdown/isolation occur) - Scheduling group video calls to support pupil wellbeing and social interaction (should a lockdown/isolation occur) 6) KS1 teachers set up to use Seesaw like EYFS with the aim of using the following functions: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Setting homework tasks to enable staff, parents and pupils to familiarise themselves with the software - Developing the use of the messaging function to allow parents and teachers to communicate more effectively - Providing detailed instructions for tasks via video or other methods (should a lockdown/isolation occur) 7) Physical work packs will still be offered to those who require them should a lockdown/isolation occur
