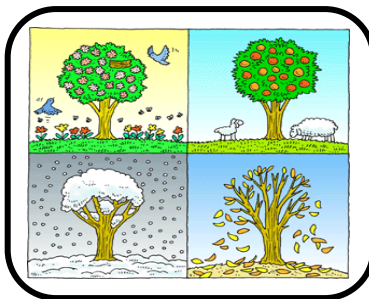
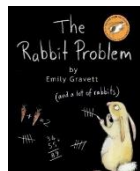

## Sticky Knowledge about the seasons

In the UK we have four seasons: spring, summer, autumn and winter. Summer is the hottest season and winter the coldest.

Seasons change throughout the year because of the way the Earth travels around the Sun.

In summer there is the longest day of the year and in winter there is the shortest day of the year.

In Autumn deciduous trees shed their leaves.

## Subject Specific Vocabulary

<b>Autumn</b>	The time of year between September and November. Many leaves fall off the trees.
<b>Spring</b>	The time of year between March and May. This is when we see signs of new growth.
<b>Summer</b>	The hottest season in the UK. It happens between June and August.
<b>Winter</b>	The coldest season in the UK. We usually have snow in this season.
<b>deciduous</b>	Deciduous trees are trees that shed their leaves once a year, usually during the season of autumn.
<b>evergreen</b>	Trees that keep their leaves all year round.
<b>weather</b>	Weather is what the sky and the air outside are like, such as cold and cloudy.
<b>seasons</b>	A year has four seasons.
<b>weather sign</b>	These are signs used by to help us understand more about our daily weather.
