

# Year 2 Curriculum Matters Summer 2

Our theme for this half term is "Where in the World am I?" This is predominantly a geography-based topic. During this topic we

will look at the fascinating islands of Hawaii and compare them with Stalybridge. In particular we will use maps, books and the internet to look at the landscape, habitat, buildings, transport and jobs available.

- I can identify the five oceans
- I can understand geographical differences through studying the human and physical geography of a small area of the UK
- I can compare a small place in the UK with a non-European country

## **English**

Our focus will be on writing narratives e.g. adventure stories. Including the story of Moana. We will also place a greater focus on handwriting, spelling and punctuation.

We will learn to...

- write narratives about personal experiences and those of others. both real and fictional.
- proof-read to check for errors in spelling, grammar and punctuation.

We will be leaning about statistics and position and direction.

We will learn to:

- Make tally charts and tables
- Use block diagrams
- Draw and interpret pictograms for 1, 2, 5 and 10
- Use the language of position
- Describe movement and turns
- Make shape patterns and turns









### Reading
