

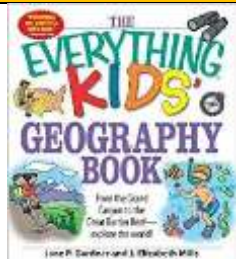

Subject Specific Vocabulary

settlement	a place where people set up a community
continent	mainland made up of different countries
country	a nation with its own government
county	large area within a country
city	a large town
town	a settlement with houses, shops and other buildings
village	a group of houses and buildings smaller than a town
hamlet	a small settlement without a church
human geography	how human activity affects the Earth
physical characteristics	natural features like rivers, mountains, forests, seas etc

Important Bits

- Settlements usually originate near rivers.
- Tourists visit UK and Italy to see modern or ancient attractions, for the weather, food, shopping or culture.
- We can use compass points and 4 figure grid references to help locate places or physical features on a map.

Sticky Knowledge about UK, including England, and Italy

Four countries in the United Kingdom- Wales, Scotland, Northern Ireland and England.

UK and Italy are both in the continent of Europe which is in the Northern Hemisphere of the world.

London is the capital city of England. The river Thames runs through it.

Manchester is our home city. The river Irwell runs through it. The Pennine mountains are nearby.

Rome is the capital city of Italy. The river Tiber runs through it.

England is split into areas called counties. Italy is split into regions called provinces.
