
## Christmas Dinner Day

# P.E Kit

School P.E kit is plain black shorts/joggers, white t-shirt, and black trainers. Children should not wear coloured tops, hoodies, or sportswear.



#### Uniform Sales

Once the remaining stock of uniform that we have in school is sold we will no longer be selling it in school. If we do not have an item in stock you need, you can purchase all our school uniform from the uniform shop in Ashton.

#### Time off in Term Time

Absences for holidays or time off in term time is not authorised, unless there is an extremeley exceptional circumstance. If your child needs time off during term time please collect a form from the office so we know how long they will be absent from school and the reason. Five days off over a twelve week period will incur a fine. The fines are  $\pounds 60.00$  per child per adult, so a family of four would be  $\pounds 240.00$ .



#### Parking around School

Please be considerate when parking around school. Please do not park on street corners and pavements as you are blocking the way for pedestrians and prams. Also be mindful about parking and blocking peoples driveways and access to their properties. All

offending vehicles will have their pictures taken and these will be submitted to the Police.

## Nut Allergies

We have several children in school with severe nut allergies, which require an Epi Pen. Please do not send your child into school with any nuts for snack or lunch as this could be life threatening to these children.





#### Cutting up Grapes

Children are not allowed to bring whole grapes to school. Please cut them into segments, to avoid choking.

#### Asthma Register

If your child has Asthma, please let the office know, so their name can be added to the Asthma Register. Can you also ensure we have an up to date copy of their Asthma Plan from their GP and that they have an in-date inhaler in school.

#### Medicines

We are not able to administer antibiotics/painkillers or any medication to children. If your child is on a course of medication or needs painkillers, either yourself, family or friends are welcome to come to school to administer it.



#### **Medical Conditions**

If your child has a medical condition or Allergy that we need to be aware of please contact the school office to discuss this. It is vital for the wellbeing of your child that this information is shared with us.

# Supervising your children before and after school

Children have been jumping the wooden nursery fence and damaging it. Also, children should not be in the MUGA, on the hill or riding around the playground on scooters/bikes before or after school. For their safety please supervise your child before and after school. Thank you
