

This is where your locker will be.




This is where you will put your water bottle and packed lunch (if you have one).

What will be expected of you in Year 6?

- You will be responsible for your water bottle, lunch, PE kit and most importantly your homework (NOT your grown ups!)
- You must follow the BEE rules (Be safe, Be kind, Be respectful, Be proud) at all times
- You may be with a different teacher, in a different room, for Maths or SPAG. We expect you to move quietly, quickly and sensibly between these sessions.
- We expect you to show the same level of respect to all adults at all times (your teachers, teaching assistants and middays)
- You may be given a Year 6 monitor role, which will mean you are responsible for something such as: Playleading, Blue Bins, Assembly Chairs, Peer Reader etc.
- English and Maths homework is given out on a Wednesday, to be handed in by Monday.
- Spellings are given out on Friday to be tested the following Friday.
- You should come into school in your PE kit on your allocated PE day. Your PE kit MUST be black bottoms (jogging bottoms/leggings/shorts) and a plain white Tshirt
