#### Reminder of School Uniform and P.E Kit

There are children coming to school in incorrect uniform and footwear. All children should be dressed in full uniform, which is grey trousers/skirt, yellow polo shirt, maroon school jumper/cardigan (black for year 6) and plain black shoes. If it is your child's P.E day they can come in P.E wear, which is plain black jogging bottoms/shorts, white t.shirt, school jumper/cardigan and plain black pumps or trainers. Children should not be wearing tracksuit tops or coloured trainers.

#### Attendance and Punctuality

Attendance and punctuality are important for all children to enable them to achieve the best outcomes and to access the Education provided. The school day starts at 08.45am.

There are a lot of children arriving late through the main entrance. Please can you make sure your child arrives on time and enters school through their class entrance. Children arriving late miss a vital part of the school day. Attendance and lateness will be monitored closely by our Attendance Officer and Welfare.



## Holidays in Term Time

Holidays or time off during term time is not authorised, unless it is an extremely exceptional circumstance. If your child needs time off during term time please collect a form from the school office, so we know long they will be absent from school and the reason. Five days off over a twelve-week period will incur a fine. The fines are £80.00 per child per adult.

# After School Clubs Collecting your Child

If your child attends an after school club, please can you ensure you let them know if your circumstances change and you no longer need them to collect your child. There are a lot of ocassions where the providers are looking for children after school only to find out they have been collected.

#### Chinese New Year

We are opening this up to the whole school, so if your child is on packed lunches they can have a lunch that day if they wish. We are not able to administer antibiotics/painkillers or any medication to children. If your child is on a course of medication or needs painkillers, either yourself, family or friends are welcome to come to school to administer it.
